The Source

PREFACE

The saints of old had a high and holy regard for Scripture. It was not only thought to be a revelation of God's nature, character and attributes, but also a covenant document that outlined the responsibility of all parties who entered into an agreement. If God's people would love, honor and obey Him, He promised to bless them beyond belief.

The book of the Psalms outlines **what happens** when we **read, hear, receive, delight in, meditate upon** and **practice** God's Word?

The Psalmist declares that God's Word delivers a great reward. It causes us to become like a fruit-bearing tree planted by the rivers of water. When we meditate upon it, God prospers everything we set our hand to do.

When we receive its insight, it brings delight. When we examine its content, we witness wondrous things that cause our heart to rejoice.

The Bible provides us with purpose, meaning, direction, guidance, knowledge and wisdom. It quickens, cleanses, converts the soul and delivers salvation.

It makes us wiser than our enemies, our teachers and even the ancients. The Word of God enlightens our eyes, warns of impending danger and keeps us from sin. It upholds, strengthens, establishes, and gives life.

It is a lamp unto our feet and a light unto our path. God's Word is our inheritance. It heals, delivers, unveils God's heart and makes known His secrets. It is said to bring great peace and make the heart sound. To those who **read, hear, receive, delight in, meditate upon and practice it**, God ensures that their children's children will sit on a king's throne.

This is what the David declares about the transforming power of God's Word. In this brief study, we will review what the nine authors of the New Testament communicate to us about the Word of God. I pray God would grant us an appreciation for the latent power present in the content of Scripture.

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THE WORD OF GOD WORD ACCORDING TO MATTHEW

According to Matthew, we succeed in life to the extent that we live by every Word that proceeds out of the mouth of God. We are called to receive, hear and rejoice in it. When we seek, hunger and thirst for righteousness (an alignment to His Word), God adds to us all those things necessary for life.

Channels of God's Word

There are several channels through which the Word of God moved in the writing of Matthew. It flowed through Jesus and His disciples. They taught and preached it to one and many. The Word flowed to Joseph and the wise men by means of angels in a dream. God communicated His Word (message) through a star that pointed the way to the new born Messiah. The Word of God was taught in the synagogues, on mountains, in open fields, by the sea side, in the village, and in the home. According to Matthew, in order to fulfill the Word of God completely, there are only two things were necessary: Love God and love our neighbor as outlined in God's moral law. The Word should flow through us. We are called to teach its observance and the obedience of its content to the nations.

What is the Word of God?

According to Matthew, it is the Word of God that defines righteousness. The Word is divine seed that can be sown in the human heart. It is the gospel of the kingdom and must be preached to the poor. The Word of God reveals all those things that have been kept secret from the foundations of the world. Jesus declared that not one jot of tittle of the law-Word of God is to pass. He has come to fulfil it. The Word is a sign to those who seek the face of God.

The Effects of the Word

The Word of God is latent with power. It was used by Jesus to battle against Satan in the wilderness. It was by the Word that Jesus healed the sick and defeated those demons that oppressed the multitudes. It is through the Word that we become fruitful. Those who practice it are promised entrance into the kingdom and those who teach it are called great.

It is those who obey the Word who are privileged to be called the brother, sister and mother of Jesus. Those who hear and practice it are likened to a wise person who built a house upon a rock. When the storms approached and the winds blew, the house stood. When the rain descended and the floods rushed in, that house escaped destruction.

Take Heed

We are to avoid doubt. It diminishes God's mighty works. We are to ensure our traditions do not transgress the commandment of God.

THE WORD OF GOD ACCORDING TO MARK

Tell your story. Mark reports that while Jesus spoke to a man who had been delivered from possession of a legion of demons, the man was instructed to communicate His message by declaring “The Lord has done great things for me and has manifested His compassion.” Jesus commanded the recipient of the miracle to tell his story.

The Channels of God’s Word

We, also, are called to tell our story of how Jesus has intervened on our behalf. We are not ashamed of the Words of Jesus; we preach good news. We are called to publish it among the nations. In fact, we are to go into all the world and preach it everywhere and to every creature. Mark informs us that as we read God’s Word we will discover both the will and thought of God. Jesus and His apostles used the Scripture to resolve theological issues by aligning the seeker with its content. We are to believe in and teach its truth. Jesus expected the religious leaders of His time to search the Scripture. He rebuked their ignorance when He declared, “Have you not read?” We often err because we do not familiar with the Scriptures.

What is the Word of God?

According to Mark, the Word is eternal. Heaven and earth may pass away, but it remains forever. Its greatest commandment is “Hear, O Israel; The Lord our God is one Lord: You shall love the Lord thy God with all thy heart, and with all thy soul, and with all thy mind, and with all thy strength.”

The Effects of the Word

When sown into the human heart, Mark informs us that the Word of God produces a divine crop. When the seed is sown on good ground, it brings forth 30-60-100 fold. Mark declares that when it is faithfully dispensed, Jesus works and confirms the Word preached with signs following.

Take Heed

Do not lay aside the Word in order to teach as doctrine the commandments of men nor make God's Word of none effect through tradition. Do not harden your heart by failing to believe its content.

THE WORD OF GOD ACCORDING TO LUKE

Luke reports that Zacharias and Elizabeth were righteous before God and walked in all the commandments and ordinances of the Lord blameless. Zacharias became dumb when he doubted the Word delivered to him by an angel. Jesus declared that we are to live by every word of God. Heaven and earth may pass away, but not one tittle of God's law-word will fail. God desires to open to us the scriptures. Jesus did so by revealing to his disciples all that was written about Him in the Law of Moses, the prophets and the Psalms. He opened their mind and gave them understanding.

Channels of God's Word

The Word of God came to and flowed through John, the son of Zacharias, in the wilderness. He went through all the country about Jordan, preaching the baptism of repentance for the remission of sins. Jesus and his disciples taught in the synagogues and often stood to read the Scripture to those who were in attendance. People pressed upon Jesus to hear God's Word. We are called to be ministers of the Word. We are to publish it. We are to use its content to tell God's story. The Word reveals all the great things God has done on our behalf.

What is God's Word?

According to Luke, it is divine seed that can be planted into the human heart. The Word of God includes the message about the kingdom of God. Only those who obeyed the Word are entitled to call Jesus Lord.

The Effects of God's Word

When commanding Satan to flee, Jesus used the Word of God as the basis for His command. Those who hear and obey God's Word are likened to a man that built a house and dug deep to lay its foundation on a rock. When the flood rose and the stream beat vehemently against that house, it was not shaken. Luke informs us that when Jesus spoke the Word, its healing power was not limited by distance. Jesus preached the gospel to the poor and declared glad tidings of the kingdom of God. The

preaching of the Word regarding the kingdom of God was often accompanied by the healing of the sick.

The Word of God reveals the mysteries of the kingdom of God. When the seed of God's Word is planted in a heart that is honest and good, it bears fruit. When we obey the Word, it produces fruit. The Word of God is received with joy and saves those that believe it. Jesus declared that those who hear and practice His word have the right to be considered His brothers, sisters and mother. Jesus declared that we shall inherit eternal life if we keep two commandments: Love God and love our neighbor. We have been provided with the Word of God in order to understand God's plan for salvation.

Take Heed

The devil seeks to steal the Word when it enters into the heart. Ensure that the Word is not choked by the cares, riches, and pleasures of this life. Do not be ashamed of Jesus or His words otherwise He will be ashamed of us when He comes in His glory.

THE ACTS OF THE APOSTLES

The apostles assigned scriptural meaning to their experiences. They held the Word of God in such high esteem that they refused to serve tables in order to preach its content. They gave themselves continually to prayer and the ministry of the Word.

Channels of God's Word

The preaching of the gospel was not limited to a select few. Those who were filled with the Holy Spirit spoke the Word of God with boldness. All who believed had a story to tell and preached the Word in the name of Jesus. Philip communicated those things concerning the kingdom of God and shared the gospel using the writings of Isaiah. The message was preached in both the synagogues and the home. It was published throughout all the region. The apostles reasoned out of the scriptures. Paul opened the scriptures and alleged that Jesus suffered, rose and that He in fact was the Christ.

Luke reports that believers were scattered because of persecution. What was their response? They preached the Word to those who desired to hear its message. Those who received and believed were astonished at the doctrine and glorified the Word of the Lord. Whole cities heard the message and understood that God's offer of salvation was open to all and must be spread to the ends of the earth. Men were moved to publicly show by the Scriptures that Jesus was Christ. Like the prophets of old, we must also become mighty in Scripture. We must receive the Word with all readiness of mind and search it daily. We must serve our generation by the will of God before we sleep.

What is God's Word?

Those who hear our message of the gospel receive words of life. The content of our message is Jesus Christ. We preach peace by Jesus Christ and that He was ordained of God to be the Judge of the quick and dead. We declare that Jesus is Lord. He has come to offer the forgiveness of sins. Our message is good news regarding the grace of God. It includes glad tidings concerning the kingdom and rule of God. The Word of God includes all the counsel of God. We expound and testify with confidence the kingdom

of God and persuade the hearer concerning Jesus, both out of the Law of Moses and prophets.

What are the effects of God's Word?

Those who gladly received the Word were baptized, continued steadfastly in the apostles' doctrine, in fellowship, in breaking of bread and in prayers. These were added to the church. The Word of God increased and the number of disciples multiplied. When Peter spoke the Word, the Holy Spirit fell on those that heard it. The believers spoke in tongues, magnified God and were baptized in the name of the Lord. The Word of God grew and multiplied. They spoke boldly in the Lord, gave testimony of the word of his grace. The Word of God grew mightily and prevailed. It builds us up and delivers an inheritance among all those who are sanctified.

Take Heed

Do not put away the Word of God. By doing so, you judge yourself unworthy of everlasting life.

THE POWER OF GOD'S WORD IN THE GOSPEL ACCORDING TO JOHN

The Gospel according to John records that the Word (Jesus) was present in the beginning. The Word was with God. In fact, the Word was God. It, the Word, was made flesh and set up camp among us. Grace and truth (the Word) came by Jesus Christ. His words were the words of Father. When Jesus came, he declared, 'I am the way, the truth, and the life. Jesus is truth incarnate.

Moses accused those who did not believe in Jesus to the Father. Those who keep the words of Jesus demonstrate their love to him. In fact, those that keep God's Word become an abode for both Father and Son. We are not alone in our desire to understand God's Word. The Holy Ghost will teach us all things. The Holy Ghost will bring all things to our remembrance what Jesus has spoken. The Spirit of truth will guide us into all truth: for he will not speak of himself. Whatever he hears from Father and Son, *that* will he speak: and he will show us things to come. The commandment of Jesus is that we love one another. We become friends of Jesus when we do what he commands. Jesus has given us Father's Word and confirms that he has been sent from above. Every one that is of the truth hears the voice of Jesus. It is those that continue in the word that are privileged to be called Disciples of Christ. Even our worship must be according to the truth of God's Word.

Channels of God's Word

Moses and the prophets wrote about Jesus. Jesus spoke the words of his indwelling Father. Some sow the word and others reap it. Men are to believe in Jesus through the Word that his disciples speak. Jesus came into the world to bear witness unto the truth.

What is God's Word?

The scriptures testify of Jesus. The Word of God is spirit and life. The utterance of God is defined as words of eternal life. God's commandment is life everlasting.

The Effects of God's Word

When Jesus battled against the devil, he took action according to Scripture. He that practices the Word comes to the light that his deeds may be made manifest, that they are wrought in God. Those who sow and reap the Word rejoice together because they receive wages and gather fruit unto eternal life. He that hears the words of Jesus and believes on Father who sent him has everlasting life, and will not come into condemnation; but is passed from death unto life. When we align our belief of Jesus to Scripture, out of our belly will flow rivers of living water. Those that keep the sayings of Jesus will never see death. If we abide in Jesus, and his words abide in us, we can ask what we will, and it will be done for us. If we keep his commandments, we will abide in his love. Jesus kept his Father's commandments and abides in Father's love. We are not left alone to decipher the meaning of God's Word. The Spirit of truth will testify of Jesus. He has manifested Father's name unto those who keep his word. Father, sanctifies us through the truth. The Word of God is written that we might believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God; and that believing ye might have life through his name.

Take Heed

There are some in whom the word has no place. He that rejects Jesus and receives not his word will be judged of Father. The words of Jesus shall judge men in the last day.

THE POWER OF GOD'S WORD IN 1-2-3 JOHN

According to John, Jesus is the living Word of life. The written Word of God that we enjoy flows from the Living Word. The Word bears witness in heaven. We accomplish several things when we walk in and keep His Word:

- 1) We demonstrate that we know and love Him
- 2) The love of God is perfected in us
- 3) We show evidence that God is indwelling us.
- 4) We abide forever

When the word of God abides in us, the truth indwells us and we overcome the wicked one. We are to love, testify about, walk in and be fellow-helpers of the Word.

If we keep His word, do those things that are pleasing in His sight, and ask anything according to His Word and Will, he hears us and we receive the petitions what we ask and desire of Him.

THE POWER OF GOD'S WORD ACCORDING TO THE REVELATION OF JOHN

According to the Revelation of John, Jesus is aware of who keeps his Word. The enemy will make war with those who keep the commandments of God and have the testimony of Jesus Christ. The actions of men are not as free as they suppose. Their actions revolve around the permissive will and sovereignty of God – God allows certain activities until His word is fulfilled. Historically, many have been beheaded for the witness of Jesus, and for the word of God.

Channels of God's Word

We are called to bare record of the word of God. John was in the isle of Patmos for the word of God.

What is the Word of God?

Jesus is called the Word of God. He held in his right hand seven stars: and out of his mouth went a sharp two-edged sword: and his countenance was as the sun shining in his strength. Jesus spoke to the church as one who has a sharp sword with two edges.

The Effects of the Word

Those who read, hear and keep the word are blessed and will be kept from the hour of temptation which will come upon all the world to try them that dwell upon the earth. Those who practice his commandments will have the right to the tree of life, and may enter in through the gates into the city.

Take Heed

Repent; or else Jesus will come to you quickly and fight against you with the sword of his mouth. Beware that you do not add or take away from God's Word otherwise God will add to you the plagues that are written in this book and will take away your part out of the book of life, and out of the holy city, and from the things that are written in this book.

THE POWER OF GOD'S WORD IN THE WRITINGS OF PAUL

The Word of God is written for our learning and is profitable for doctrine, reproof, correction and instruction in righteousness

What is the Word of God?

Paul informs us that Scripture (Old Testament) is God's very breath. It is called the power of God and the Sword of the Spirit. It is holy, just, good, spiritual and contains the unsearchable riches of Christ.

Channels of God's Word

We are called to preach it, teach it, sing it, pray it and live it. Paul states that the Spirit uses various gifts to dispense the Word of God. The Holy Spirit uses the gifts of ... The Word of wisdom, The Word of knowledge, Prophecy, Tongues and the Interpretation of tongues in order to communicate God's message. Paul also informs us that the Word is released through the channels of revelation, knowledge, doctrine, preaching, psalms, hymns, and spiritual songs.

What are the effects of the Word of God?

What happens when we expose ourselves to the study and practice of the Word of God? The Word... reveals and judges the secrets of the heart. Those who read it are admonished, reprovved, rebuked, exhorted, built up, comforted, convinced, sanctified and cleansed.

The Word ... reveals the mysteries and will of God. It unveils hidden wisdom. It brings the reader glory, honor and peace. It has the power to save us from self, sin, the devil and the currents of the age. The Word increases our faith and brings hope. It establishes those who handle it and causes them to grow.

The Word ... delivers a reward and brings life everlasting. It reconciles us to God and infuses us with the Spirit. When we believe it, we are sealed with the Holy Spirit. When

it works in us, we are perfected to do the work of ministry. When it effectually works in us, it brings forth fruit, fills us with the knowledge of God's will, edifies and makes us fruitful in and unto every good work. When it richly indwells us, it presents us complete in Christ.

The Spirit sanctifies us through the Word. The Word of God produces godliness and brings us to the full knowledge of the truth. The Word brings life and immortality to light. It makes us wise unto salvation. It is through the Word that we sanctify our food before enjoying its nourishment.

We value the Word so much that we share our resources with those that expound it. We believe that those who teach it are worthy of double honor and salary.

THE POWER OF GOD'S WORD IN THE WRITINGS OF PETER

According to epistles of Peter, the Word came to us by holy men of God who spoke as they were moved by the Holy Spirit.

What is the Word of God?

It is incorruptible seed. It is eternal. It lives, abides and endures forever. The Word is a more sure Word of prophecy. No prophecy in the Word is of any private interpretation.

Channels of God's Word

We are encouraged to be mindful of the Word of God as spoken by the prophets, apostles and Jesus. We are called to speak it with the ability He gives us. Men, women and children must be won over by the contents of the Word.

What are the Effects of God's Word?

As incorruptible seed, the Word contains power to beget and bring forth life. It is through the Word that we acquire our knowledge of God and come to know our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. It is through the Word that we become partakers of God's divine nature. The new believer or new born babe is called to drink the sincere milk of the Word in order to grow in grace. It is the Word that multiplies grace and peace in us. It also establishes those who receive it. It is the latent power in the Word that helps us to escape the corruption and pollution of the world.

THE POWER OF GOD'S WORD IN THE EPISTLES OF JAMES

According to James, we are born again through the Word of truth. It is the Word of God that makes us a specimen of God's new creation. We are called to receive with meekness the engrafted Word. It has power to save our souls.

Our journey begins with hearing the Word, but matures as we become its doers. We do the Word when we do the Work and are blessed as a result. We fulfill God's royal law by demonstrating love to our neighbors.

It is through the Word that we are able to convert and restore those who stray from the truth.

THE POWER OF GOD'S WORD IN THE EPISTLES OF JUDE.

According to Jude, the Word includes the message regarding our common salvation. We are to content for the faith delivered unto us. We are to fend off those that live contrary to the truth as it is found in the Word of God. The Word of God provides many examples of those life-styles judged by God. We are called to remember the words of the apostles and of our Lord Jesus Christ.

THE POWER OF GOD'S WORD IN THE LETTER TO THE HEBREWS

God has spoken His Word unto us by His Son. The worlds were framed by the Word of God. We are to give heed to God's Word. Unbelief will bar us from entering into God's best. The Word profits us only when it is mixed with faith.

The Word of God is quick, powerful, and sharper than any two-edged sword. It pierces even to the dividing asunder of soul and spirit. It pierces even to the dividing asunder of the joints and marrow. The Word of God is a discerner of the thoughts and intents of the heart. Those who only drink the spiritual milk of the Word are unskillful in the Word of righteousness. We must mature and begin eating the spiritual meat of the Word. The first principles (milk) of the Word are outlined. They include the following doctrines:

- 1) Repentance from dead works
- 2) Faith toward God
- 3) The Doctrine of Baptisms
- 4) Laying on of hands
- 5) Resurrection of the dead
- 6) Eternal judgment

We are privileged. We have been enlightened; we have tasted of the heavenly gift and have become partakers of the Holy Spirit through the Word of God. We have tasted the good Word of God and the powers of the world to come. We have also inherited the promises through its content.

God has promised to put His covenant Word in our minds and write them on our hearts. We receive God's promises after we obey his Word and Will. We are called to remember those who speak the Word of God. We are to follow their faith and suffer the word of exhortation.

CONCLUSION AND SUMMARY

THE LIFE-CHANGING EFFECTS OF GOD'S WORD IN THE NEW TESTAMENT

It delivers specific knowledge about repentance from dead works, faith toward God, baptisms, the laying of hands, the resurrection of the dead and eternal judgment. The Word of God is profitable for doctrine, reproof, correction and instruction in righteousness. When delivered faithfully, its message is confirmed by signs following. When sent forth with integrity, the Word of God dispenses the unsearchable riches of Christ.

The Word of God prepares us for service. It makes us wise unto salvation and produces godliness in those who hear and obey it. When we receive its wisdom, the Word of God reproves, rebukes, admonishes, exhorts, establishes, convinces, and edifies in order to make us fruitful in and unto every good work. It prepares us to do

the work of ministry and aids us in the restoration of those who have strayed from the faith.

The Word of God changes us. When we receive its truth, it brings about a new birth and causes us to pass from death into life. It transforms us into a new specimen of God's new creation, makes us partakers of the Holy Spirit and provides us with a taste of the powers of the world to come. It enlightens, cleanses, and sanctifies us. It purifies the soul and sets it free. It presents us complete in Christ and brings glory, honor and peace. To those who believe, it offers salvation from sin, self, the currents of the age and the devil. To those who embrace the Word, it causes rivers of living water to flow from our belly. The Word of God blesses, comforts and confirms that we are true Disciples of Christ. It teaches the reader how to secure the right to be in relationship with Jesus and call him Lord.

What attributes does the Word of God possess? It is eternal, holy, just, good, spiritual and has power to bring forth life. It discerns, reveals and judges the thoughts, intents and secrets of the heart. It is spirit and life. It quickens those who hear it and is sharper than any two-edged sword. It divides asunder soul and spirit. When sown, it grows mightily and prevails.

What benefits does the Word of God afford?

As a result of receiving and obeying it, we receive wages and gather fruit unto eternal life. It produces a divine crop in us and increases our faith. It brings forth and bears fruit in us. It brings life everlasting and perfects the love of God in us. The Word of God causes us to abide forever. Father and Son make their abode in those who hear and obey it. It infuses us with God's character and divine nature. Its truth offers us everlasting life and rescues us from condemnation. The Word delivers us from death and ministers life through the name of Jesus. It multiplies peace and delivers the grace of God. It blesses its reader. To the obedient, it provides all those things necessary for life. It provides an entrance into the kingdom and makes its teachers great. The Word of God extends life, brings hope and delivers a reward. It reconciles us to God. It

infuses and seals us with the Spirit. It causes us to grow in grace. It brings life and immortality to light. By it, we sanctify our food. The Word of God offers nourishing and spiritual milk. When uttered, it may bring about an outpouring of the Holy Spirit. Obedience to it guarantees we receive what we ask. Those who hear and keep it are considered friends of God. The Word gives us answered prayer when we make a request to God. It increase and multiples disciples. The Word of God delivers promises and makes available to us a divine inheritance. It brings success. Obedience to it will give its recipients a right to the tree of life and allow them entrance into the gates of the city of God. It will deliver us from the hour of temptation. The Word of God enables us to escape the corruption and pollution of the world and empowers us to withstand the storms of life.

Take Heed

All who have breath will be judged in the last day according to God's Word. Do not yield to doubt concerning its content or harden your heart by failing to believe its message. If God said it, He will do it. If He spoke it, He will bring it to pass. Doubt diminishes God's mighty works.

Ensure that your traditions do not make God's Word of none effect or that you do not transgress the commandment of God by giving tradition greater honor. Do not lay aside the Word in order to teach as doctrine the commandments of men.

Be aware that the devil seeks to steal the Word when it enters into the heart. Do not allow the Word to be choked by the cares, riches, and pleasures of this life. Do not be ashamed of Jesus or His words otherwise he will be ashamed of us when he comes into His glory. Do not be deceived. Those that put away the word of God judge themselves unworthy of everlasting life. There are some in whom the word has no place. He that rejects Jesus and receives not his word will be judged of Father.

The words of Jesus shall judge us in the last day. He commands and calls all to repentance or else he will come and fight against us with the sword of his mouth. Take heed that

you do not add or take away from His Word, otherwise He will add to you the plagues that are written in His Word or take away your part out of the book of life, and out of the holy city, and from the things which are written in his Word.
